## TRADES PROGRAMS

Programs are funded by Stitsma Employment Centre and our partners. The following trade courses lead to Red Seal Certification by ITA and is registered by PCTIA:

### Construction Orientation and Retention for Employees (CORE) Program

The CORE training program is a 6 week pre-employment program that is designed for First Nations people who are interested in the construction industry. The program provides industry safety and certifications. CORE allows students the opportunity to explore a career in construction.

### Carpentry 1

*(Red Seal Certified upon completion)*

Carpentry 1 is a 6 week program. Students are required to have a minimum of 1200 hours of construction/carpentry experience. They receive their first year towards Red Seal Certification (upon completion of a 4 year program).

### Carpentry 2

*(Red Seal Certified upon completion)*

After successful completion of 1200 work hours and Carpentry 1, you can register for Carpentry 2 which covers training in concrete, form work and rigging.
