



CALL TO SQUAMISH NATION ARTISTS: HSBC CANADA SEVENS MEDAL & MEDALLION DESIGN

HSBC Canada Sevens is a two-day indoor rugby sevens tournament, hosted March 9-10, 2019 at the world-class BC Place Stadium, host venue to Canada’s most prestigious events, and will feature 16 of the world’s top men’s sevens teams.

Teams will compete for the gold, silver and bronze medal tournament weekend. All medals, trophies, and medallions awarded will feature artwork by Squamish, Musqueam, or Tsleil-Waututh Nation members.

Squamish Nation is seeking two designs by Squamish artists. One design will be used for the HSBC Canada Sevens silver medal, and one design for a commemorative medallion.

The selected artists will each receive \$1,250 for their design.

Medal/Medallion Designs:

The designs for these medals are open to artistic interpretation. We encourage incorporating important cultural elements that represent all things “sevens”: sport, strength, culture, community, celebration, etc.

Design Specifications:

- The artwork will be placed in a circular design (approx. 2”-3” diameter).
- Due to production we encourage sharp lines in the design, as shading and intricate details cannot be re-produced.

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- Each artist must submit **TWO*** design options in **digital format** (PDF or JPEG) for consideration by the selection committee. (Hand-drawn designs cannot be accepted.)
 - *Keep in mind that the designs must be appropriate for use on a 2” diameter medallion.*
- Each design must include a brief write-up explaining the meaning of, and inspiration behind, the artwork.
- Submit art, write-ups, and contact information (full name, telephone number and email) via email to communications@squamish.net with “Canada Sevens Designs” in the subject line.

SUBMISSION DEADLINE: THURSDAY, JANUARY 24, 2019, 4:30 pm

Late submissions will not be accepted.

**Two submissions are required per artist to ensure we are able to submit a unique design (i.e., no duplication of designs/motifs) on behalf of Squamish Nation. Musqueam and Tsleil-Waututh are also submitting designs, and it is important that each medal and medallion features a distinctly different design.*
