### Plans for Increased Administrative Space in Squamish Valley

One of the objectives in Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw 2026, the Nation's Strategic Plan, is to "Build or expand facilities to meet the needs of the Skwxwú7mesh government to deliver quality programs and services on the North Shore, Squamish Valley, and at Seńákw."

Work has been underway to explore expanding Totem Hall in Squamish Valley. Since tem welhxs (February) 2021, the following has been completed:

- Evaluation of previous plans to renovate and expand Totem Hall.
- Evaluation of the current space needs for Squamish Valley services.
- Preliminary land use planning for St'á7mes, including Upper St'á7mes (as a result of the Mortenson Lands being added through the Addition to Reserve process in 2021).
- Identification of a potential future location for a new Squamish Valley Community Centre.
- Identification of a short-term project to expand administrative space in Squamish Valley.

Implementation of the previous Totem Hall expansion plans would require a significant amount of shuffling around current buildings and services. Therefore, staff identified two lots nearby that could serve as the location for a temporary expansion of Totem Hall. Ta na wa Shéway I7xw ta Úxwumixw (Planning & Capital Projects) and Ta na wa Ch'áwat ta Sxwéxwel (Squamish Valley Operations) are working together to develop a plan for the design of the temporary space.

Nexwsxwníwntm ta Úxwumixw (Council) approved designating the proposed lots for administrative use. The two departments will continue to work together to integrate long-term administrative space needs into the overall Land Use Strategy for St'á7mes, as well as other priorities, as identified by the Squamish Valley community.



### **First Phase of Housing Policies Approved**

Throughout 2022, feedback was sought from community about potential updates to the current Housing Policy. It became clear that a single policy could no longer incorporate all the updates required. Therefore, it was decided to create 13 individual policies divided by topic and guided by one overarching Housing Policy Framework.

The work to create the individual policies is taking place in phases. On tem tsá7tskaý (April) 13, 2023 Nexwsxwníwntm ta Úxwumixw (Council) approved the Housing Policy Framework, the Home Construction Policy and the Maintenance and Renovations Policy.
