

Interim Chief Administrative Officer Appointed



On Tem welhxs (February) 22, Sheldon Tetreault joined the Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw as Interim Chief Administrative Officer. He has been tasked to oversee the day-to-day operations of the Nation and as a new leader, is here to listen and help us build on our successes. Sheldon is deeply committed to supporting Indigenous success and hopes to engage in learning everything he can about our culture, our history, and the Skwxwú7mesh sníchim.

A proud Métis and Franco-Manitoban, Sheldon has worked closely with First Nations governments across Canada for over twenty-five years. During this time, he assisted many Nations working on strategic initiatives such as self-determination, education, and reconciliation. He has also held senior roles in Indigenous governments, including the role of Chief Administrative Officer for the Lilwat7úl (Lil'wat Nation). He participated in the development and ratification of the Shared Legacy Agreement establishing the Nation as one of the 'Four Host First Nations' of the Vancouver 2010 Winter Olympics and currently sits on the Board of Directors for the Lil'wat Business Corporation.

Research Project on Intergovernmental Agreements Supports Strategic Plan

Building nation-to-nation relationships with all levels of government based on mutual respect, collaboration, equality, and meaningful engagement is a key goal in the Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw Strategic Plan 2020-2023. To help achieve this, Nexwsxwníwntm ta Úxwumixw (Council) recognizes the importance of gathering information around best practices in creating and maintaining relationship agreements.

The Nation, through the Ta7lnewás (Education, Employment & Training) department, has supported several university research projects involving Skwxwú7mesh topics when the proposed projects are carried out in a respectful way and the knowledge can be shared for the benefit of the Nation.

On Tem welhxs (February) 10, Nexwsxwníwntm ta Úxwumixw indicated its support for Andrea Reimer's research project at the University of British Columbia School of Public Policy and Global Affairs (SPPGA) titled "Best Practices for Developing & Maintaining Relationship Agreements That Advance Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw Strategic Goals". The project's findings will support Ta na wa Yúus ta Stitúyntsam (Rights & Title) with their ongoing work to update relationships agreements and ensure that future intergovernmental agreements are based upon and rooted in Skwxwú7mesh values.
