

Skwxwú7mesh Census Open Until tem cháyilhen (September) 30

To plan for our Nation's continued growth and prosperity, we need a clearer picture of our over 4000 Members' quality of life and priorities. That is why the Nation has launched a Skwxwú7mesh Census. Our Elders have named the census Eslhílhkw'iws Chet, which translates to "we are all related".

It is not mandatory to complete the census, however filling it out will give the Nation the data it needs to develop programs, services, and budgets that better serve all Members. It will also be used to help create Úxwumixw 2050 – the Nation's Generational Plan.

Eslhílhkw'iws Chet respects self-determination so Members can fill in as much, or as little, as they like. The core questionnaire 'In My House' is completed by one person on behalf of their household. The other topics can be completed by any Member. Every Skwxwú7mesh Member 18+ living on- or off-reserve is eligible to complete the census. Parents/caregivers are asked to respond on behalf of minor children.

The Skwxwú7mesh Census is different from the federal one as all the data collected will be completely owned by the Nation. All information will be stored securely respecting confidentiality. Nexwsxwníwntm ta Úxwumixw (Council) and Nation employees will not be able to see anyone's individual answers. More information about the census is available at squamish.net/census.





There are two ways to complete the census. Scan the QR code or visit bit.ly/squamish-census to fill out the census online. You can also call 604-373-9735 to book an appointment with one of the door-to-door enumerators, who are Nation Members. The deadline to complete the census is September 30, 2022.

Vote Yes to Reclaiming Education





Ta7lnewás (Education, Employment & Training) department is leading a project to take back control of our ménmen (children)'s education. Residential schools aimed to take our language, culture, and heritage from us, and we have been working to overcome that harmful legacy.

There is an opportunity to reclaim the right to educate our ménmen, from preschool to Grade 12, in a way that is uniquely Skwxwú7mesh. Students who attend on-reserve schools will be taught from a Skwxwú7mesh worldview so that they can grow up confident in our culture and values, which will improve our graduation rate. The Nation would be able to incorporate more language and land-based learning as well as set its own qualification process for teachers.

On etl'ím lhkaych' (December 1), 2022, Nation Members will be asked to vote and approve two documents which will set the foundation for building our own education system and law. First is an Education Law-Making Protocol (the process for how an Education Law will be developed and approved) and the second is a Jurisdiction Agreement (an education agreement with Canada).

If Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw votes yes, then the work will begin on building our education system, together. Through consultation and feedback, we will develop a system – including elements such as curriculum, graduation requirements, and teacher certification – that meets the needs and desires of our children and community. The goal is to implement an Education Law for the start of the 2023 school year.
