



Hiýám Housing to Conduct Affordable Housing Needs Assessment



Developing a variety of housing that enables Members to stay in our communities and connected to our lands and culture is one of the Nation's top priorities. To support this critical work, the Hiyám Housing Society Strategic Plan 2021-2026 has identified several key objectives, including conducting a housing needs assessment.

The needs assessment will collect and measure data on community identified housing needs and lived experience. It will look at topics like "what types of housing programs are a priority?", "are there any portions of the population that are expected to grow faster than others in the next 25 years?" or "what barriers exist to accessing housing?" The data collected will ensure that Hiyam Housing creates projects and programs that meet the current and future affordable housing needs of the community. It will also support the development of a housing strategy.

This project is in the beginning stages and the first step is to issue a Request For Proposals (RFP) to conduct the needs assessment. On Tem lhawt' (March) 3, Nexwsxwníwntm ta Úxwumixw (Council) approved the RFP. Hiýám Housing will communicate more information as soon as it is available.

Hiýám Housing was created on October 8, 2019 with a mandate from Nexwsxwníwntm ta Úxwumixw to develop and manage non-profit housing for the community, working towards the goal of housing all Skwxwú7mesh within a generation (25 years). Research Project on Adult Indigenous Language Learning Supports Strategic Plan

A key goal in the Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw Strategic Plan 2020-2023 is for the Skwxwú7mesh Sníchim to be widely used in the community within a generation. To help achieve this, Nexwsxwníwntm ta Úxwumixw (Council) recognizes the importance of gathering information and best practice around how language learners can be supported to progress to advanced proficiency, especially in communities where there are few or none first language speakers.

Through the Ta7Inewás (Education, Employment & Training) department, proposed university research projects involving Skwxwú7mesh topics have been supported when they are carried out in a respectful way and the knowledge can be shared for the benefit of the Nation.
