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Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw Protocol Policy Approved

On tem yetwán (May) 4, Nexwsxwníwntm ta Úxwumixw (Council) approved the Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw Protocol Policy. There is a lack of public awareness around what our Skwxwú7mesh protocols are. Nexwsxwníwntm ta Úxwumixw wishes to ensure that the Nation is represented in various partnerships and that protocols are being respected within our Territory.

The purpose of the Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw Protocol Policy is to define the processes and proper rules of engagement with Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw as a government and community for all levels of government, businesses, other partners, and the public. It does not apply to ceremonial or cultural activities that are traditionally the responsibility of families. Instead, it focuses on events or ceremonies where Skwxwú7mesh representation, particularly by elected leadership, is requested or strategic to the Nation's interests.

Ta na wa Cheńtm (Chair & Council Office) staff are now working on an intake process for protocol requests, creating a curriculum for partners on Skwxwú7mesh protocol, and working with Chairperson and Nexwsxwníwntm ta Úxwumixw on a process for ensuring compliance within our Territory.

Business Case for Expansion of Xwmélch'sten Estímxwawtxw

Xwmélch'sten Estímxwawtxw (Capilano Littlest Ones) has continued to grow and add additional grades since it was built in 2004. In 2020, Nexwsxwníwntm ta Úxwumixw (Council) requested that an assessment of the current facilities be conducted to determine what is needed to support the future educational needs of our ménmen (children). Since then, s7ulh wa nexwniwéyalh (Our Ways of Education), the Reclaiming Education initiative, received strong support from Members for the development of a K-12 system.

A feasibility study was completed in tem kw'élemexw (July) 2022 and identified a potential distributed campus structure. It would include the current school site and expand to make use of the wooded area to the south and west in order to support further land-based learning.

On tem yetwán (May) 18, Nexwsxwníẃntm ta Úxwumixw directed Ta na wa Shéway I7xw ta Úxwumixw (Planning & Capital Projects) and Ta7lneẃás (Education, Employment & Training) to proceed with developing a Business Case.

It will look at things like project budget and operational costs, updated demographic data and school enrollment projections, as well as input from staff, parents, and the wider community.

Nexwsxwníwntm ta Úxwumixw also requested that a Needs Assessment be conducted to support K-12 education goals in the Squamish Valley.

Developing feasibility studies and business cases are technical steps required under the Capital Planning & Projects Policy however, there will be opportunities for the community to learn more and provide input at key stages as the projects progress.


