DRUG & ALCOHOL FREE ZONES ANNOUNCED

In order to promote and support more family friendly environments on Reserve, Chiefs and Council approved a Council Order to designate certain areas of Reserves Drug and Alcohol free.

Effective immediately public intoxication or consumption of alcohol in the areas identified below is not permitted.

The attached maps have the Zones clearly marked

Capilano IR #5

- **Zone 1** - Capilano River on both sides of the river between the bridges.
- **Zone 2** - Xwmelch'sten (Capilano) Field and adjacent buildings, Lacrosse Box, Chief Joe Mathias Centre, and Capilano Little Ones School.

Mission IR#1

- **Zone 3** – the courtyard, parking lot and common areas of the Mission Townhouses between West 4th and West 5th.

Stawamus IR24

- **Zone 4** - the water front area around the Canoe Shed and Totem Hall.

Please be advised that the Liquor Control and Licensing Act is enforceable on Reserve and the Nation has requested the local police to enforce it and re-enforce community safety in these areas relating to any drug or alcohol use.

This Notice and Maps will be made available on the Squamish Nation website for reference. We are asking our community members to be vigilant and contact local police or the Integrated First Nations Policing Unit to report any use of drug or alcohol in these designated Zones.

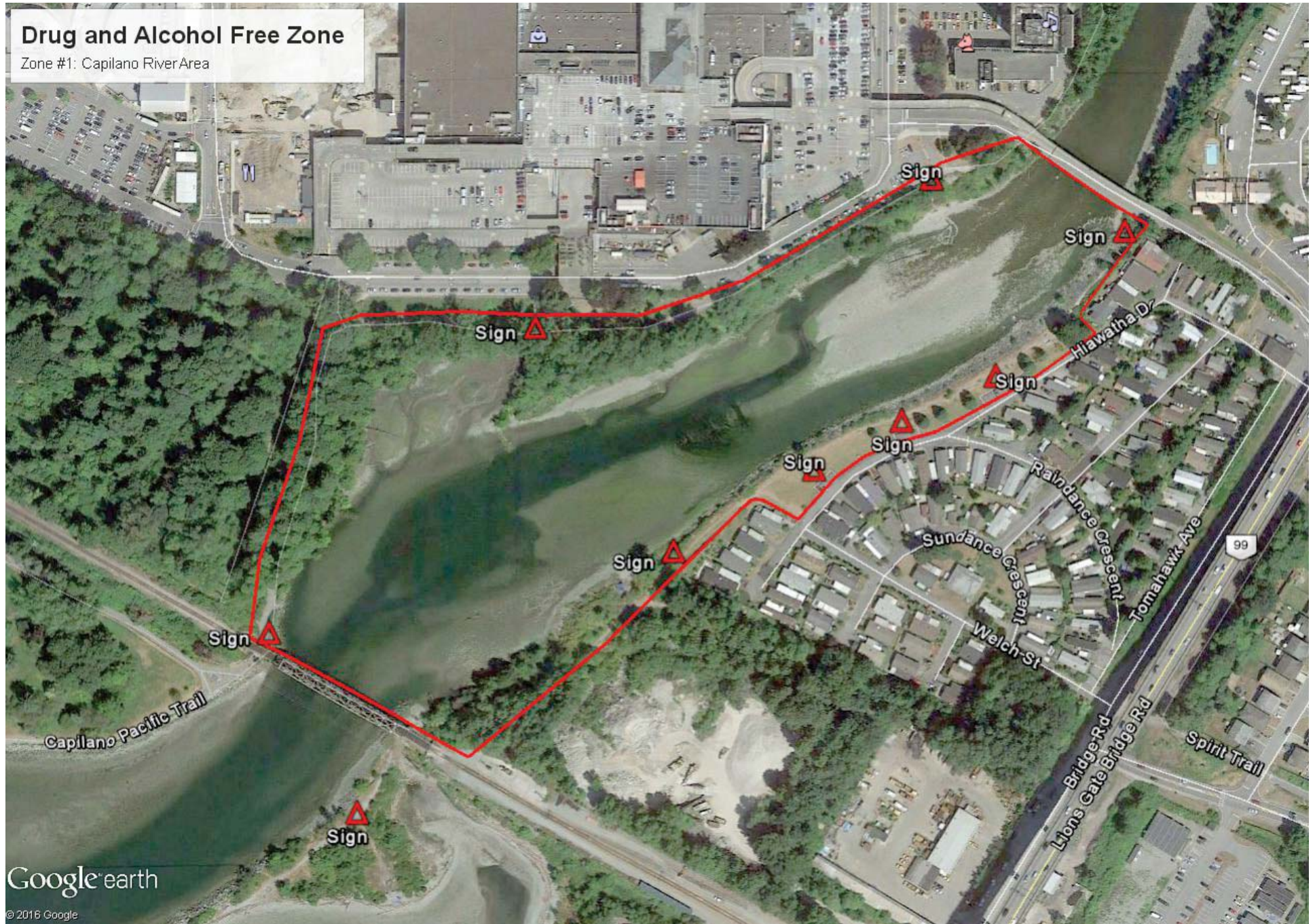
The Nation will be installing signage in all these areas identifying them as drug and alcohol free.
