Update from Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw Rights & Title and Environmental Working Group

Please be advised that rolling lane closures are expected along Mamquam Forest Service Road as part of road upgrades for Eagle Mountain Pipeline construction.

WOODFIBRE LNG WASTE DISCHARGE

AUTHORIZATION

Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw takes an interest in any consequential environmental permit being considered by other regulators for the Woodfibre LNG and FortisBC projects. For Waste Discharge Authorization proposals, we consider the following when reviewing these applications:

- Is the proposal reasonable given the stewardship interests in surrounding environment (e.g. Átl'ka7tsem/Howe Sound, or Squamish River)?
- If the proposal warrants consideration, skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw has specialists retained in water treatment, eco-toxicology, and permitting. These professionals are independent of the proponents or any partisan groups. Technical plans are reviewed to determine if the details are responsible construction practices. Plans are viewed in the full context of broader environmental studies and monitoring being done by both companies. Often this is a broader set of materials than the reports linked to one specific permit application.
- We provide feedback to the permitting agencies, such as BC Energy Regulator, and meet with them to discuss expectations. We put necessary trust in other agencies to fulfill their role.
- We are involved in reviewing the monitoring plans and reports that arise from any major permit, to give confidence that outcomes in the field are what was intended on paper.

CURRENT CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

With both projects in the construction phase you may observe more activity downtown and at Swiýát.

Swiýát (WOODFIBRE LNG)

- Grading
- Exploratory excavations; removing any remaining building debris and obtructions from demo of old buildings in preparation for soil improvements
- Shoreline reconfiguration
- Tree falling
- Equipment mobilization
- Pile driving

FORTIS BC EAGLE MOUNTAIN PIPELINE

- Forest service road upgrades (including grading and culvert installations)
- Hydrovac to locate utilities
- Road upgrades
- Preparing the tunnel portal sites in anticipation of tunnel boring machines launching in the new year

Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw Indigenous Monitors Now On Site!

Ta na wa Yúus ta Stitúyntsam (Rights and Title Department) is pleased to announce that we have trained and hired two Lead Monitors and two Indigenous Monitors to monitor the construction of the FortisBC Eagle Mountain Pipeline (EGP) to transfer natural gas from north of Coquitlam to Swiýát (the WoodfibreLNG site).

All of these monitors completed environmental, cultural and archaeological training and will be on site every day for the next two years to monitor activities, discuss concerns, and find solutions.

Ta na wa Yúus ta Stitúyntsam is also in the process of on-boarding additional Indigenous monitors to oversee construction activities at the Woodfibre LNG site.
