Today, the shishalh (Sechelt) Nation publicly <u>provided an update</u> about their archaeological research project into St. Augustine's Residential Institution, including the results of ground penetrating radar (GPR). Please note that there are some distressing details in the video posted on the shishalh website.

We are mindful of how difficult this news may be to receive as many from our community were forced to attend this institution. There are extended supports in place for our people today and in the coming days.
