

SQUAMISH NATION BOOTS ON THE GROUND

Ta na wa Yúus ta Stitúyntsam (Rights and Title Department) will train and hire Indigenous Monitors to monitor the construction of the FortisBC Eagle Mountain Pipeline (EGP) to transfer natural gas from north of Coquitlam to Swiýát (the WoodfibreLNG site). The training will include environmental and archaeological training. The monitors will work closely with the FortisBC and WoodfibreLNG environmental inspection teams to observe construction activities, discuss concerns, and find solutions. They will be the eyes and ears for the Nation on-site.



FortisBC BC Rail Site Construction Activities

Starting late October FortisBC will start delivering pipe to the BC Rail Site in preparation for tunnel construction. In order to mitigate any impacts to Yekwaupsum residents, FortisBC has reduced the volume of trucks from 80 to 50 per day (approximately 5 per hour) with reduced speed of 15 km/hr in and around Yekwaupsum 18. In addition, they plan to be adaptively managing any concerns if they do arise.

The hours for the deliveries will be 7 am to 6 pm Monday to Friday, and 8 am to 6 pm on Saturdays, for the three week period.
