Our Team would like to remind all residents to please keep the main roads cleared so the entire road gets properly cleared of snow and roads can be salted/sanded.



A Statement from the Electoral Commission

Date: January 11, 2024

We wish to provide an update regarding the vacant Nexwsxwníwntm ta Úxwumixw (Council) seat following the passing of our late respected Councillor and Elder.

Skwxwú7mesh Membership clearly set out its wishes regarding by-election processes in these circumstances when they enacted the Election & Referendum Law on December 6, 2018. This by-election will be conducted in accordance with that Law and the process is as follows.

The runner up, as voted by Membership in the last general election, will be contacted by the Electoral Commission Chairperson to confirm if they remain eligible and wish to swear the oath of office and assume the vacant seat on Nexwsxwníwntm ta Úxwumixw (Council).

If the runner up is no longer eligible, refuses, or fails to indicate their desire within 30 days to assume the vacant position, the Electoral Commission will set a date to hold a vote of Skwxwú7mesh eligible voters and open nominations for candidates to fill that vacancy.

Membership will continue to be informed as these processes under the Law are carried out. chet kw'enmantúmiyap (we thank you all).

About the Electoral Commission

The Electoral Commission was established in 2015 as an independent institution of the Nation to oversee fair and transparent elections and referendums. It is made up of seven voting members, two alternates, and one non-voting member. Each seat represents a particular region or demographic of the community.

Dear Squamish Nation Members,

We are writing to provide you with an update on our planned next steps for Mosquito Creek Marina.

Last month, we shared with you that most docks at Mosquito Creek Marina must close on May 31st, 2024. This means that all property (including boats and boatsheds, excluding float homes) be removed from the marina by May 31st, 2024.

Current residential occupants of boats and boatsheds in the Marina are also encouraged, but will not be required, to vacate the Marina by May 31st, 2024. However, MCM cannot commit to indefinite residential occupancy by boat or boatshed residents within the Marina. If any current residential occupants of MCM boats and boatsheds are unable to relocate from the Marina by May 31st, 2024, MCM will continue to work with those parties to assist in their relocation to other residential accommodation.

We know that there are Squamish Nation Members who are part of the Mosquito Creek Marina community. Over the coming weeks, we will reach out directly to work with those affected to provide support and options. We have already connected with most of you and will continue that outreach.

Following the implementation of the immediate emergency repairs required to stabilize MCM docks for the winter, we expect long-range planning work will begin to develop extensive rehabilitation or possible redevelopment plans for the MCM site. A reminder that redevelopment on Squamish Nation reserve lands requires us to follow a clearly defined process, which includes a Council mandate, a formal member engagement process, and, ultimately, a designation vote.



This is a reminder to all Nation Members that the North Vancouver Eslha7áń Townhomes are under the Management of Hiỷáṁ Housing Society. The Squamish Nation and Community Operations do not cover the costs of garbage disposal, or any junk removal services at the Townhomes.

Dumping of any kind on the property is <u>not</u> permitted at any time.

The garbage bins and recycling containers are for the tenants of the townhomes only. All vehicles and persons dumping on the property are being recorded and reported to the Nation for possible collection of fees associated to the extra garbage pick-up costs.

Please be respectful of the property and your fellow community members. The Eslha7áń Townhomes are not a dumping ground or a scrap yard.



Gather here in Squamish from November to February every year. Sp'akw'us - Eagles:

tl'ítl'elxiws-the Dolly Varden, syuykw'úlu7- Cut Throat and syúykw'ula-Rainbow Fishing:

Trout run January and February in our Squamish waters.

<u>tl'asíp - Licorice Root</u>: Is good for sore throats and for your respiratory system. Helps boost effects of other medicines. Can be gathered all year long.

<u>Hunting Season</u>: Hunting season for **sxwi7shen**-deer. Hunting for **xwuxwsélken** mountain goat meat is in the fall and winter. We also gathered mountain goat hair in the

spring when the mountain goats were shedding.

tl'e7énk ~ tl'enk - Potlatching: Held in winter months. Families do work for naming, memorials

<u>Syewen - Winter dances</u> start in November and go until Feb/March.





Medical Travel for Members: Info Sheet

When a member books a medical appointment that is more than 30 km away from home, they can get a Gas PO. This happens in two ways:

1) Any Member can contact Caroline @ Health Benefits directly and request a PO. The PO will be made out in the Member's name & if a friend or family member is driving, their name will also be included on the PO.

The Member or someone acting for them can pick up the PO at the Waterfront Office.

2) Elders contact the Elders Team and book a ride with them. Elders Drivers complete a Medical Transportation Intake Form (see reverse) and email it to Caroline, who makes a PO for the Member Vehicle. Intake forms must be made for each booking even if Members are travelling together.

The PO will be made out in the Member's name, with the Member Driver's name included. The PO will be given to the Member Driver.

Gas PO Policy:

- a) **48 hours-notice is required for ALL Gas PO requests**. Urgent requests will be considered on a case by case basis, time permitting.
- b) Only one active PO can be issued per appointment/trip; and Multiple PO's will NOT be issued if travelling members are ride-sharing in any way.
- c) PO's are non-transferrable.
- d) **24 hours-notice is required for cancellations** with the Elder Drivers, as well as requests to change any Gas PO.



Who we are:

UNYA has been supporting the health and wellbeing of Indigenous youth in the Metro Vancouver area for over 30 years. As a respected non-profit, charitable organization, we recognize Indigenous youth as experts in their own lives and strive to provide youth with programs and opportunities that are relevant and meaningful to them.

At Urban Native Youth Association UNYA we have developed a Philosophy of Care foundation, drawing from best practices. These philosophies are the grounding framework that shapes all of our decisions and every interaction we have with the youth we serve. Following these philosophies empowers our staff to meet youth where they are at, by giving them the ability to balance flexibility and structure. This allows us to meet our youth's needs, and ensure that our youth experience a consistent quality of care across all UNYA programs. Our 5 key philosophies are:

- Trauma-Informed Practice
- Two-Eyed Seeing
- Harm Reduction Practice
- Youth/Person Centered Practice
- Culture as Therapy

Highlights of this opportunity:

As a member of the Aboriginal Youth Safehouse program team the Youth Care Counsellor is responsible for supporting the youth in identifying their individual needs and setting positive goals for the future. The 24-hour program provides stabilization care and temporary housing to those who do not have a safe space to stay. The position focuses on each youth's unique strengths and supports them to obtain housing, employment, education, training, and life-skills, as well as to positively address alcohol and drug, mental health, and physical health issues, or anything else youth feel they need support with. The Aboriginal Youth Safehouse Team reports directly to the Program Manager. **This position maintains a schedule of five, 8-hour shifts from Tuesday to Saturday 7am – 3pm.**

Qualifications and Conditions:

- 1. Educational experience required (example: Bachelor's Degree in a relevant field, 2 years of recent related experience, or an equivalent combination of education, training, and experience)
- 2. Experience working with the Indigenous community. Must demonstrate a good working knowledge of community resources in Vancouver, particularly youth & Indigenous-specific resources.
- 3. Knowledge and understanding of the family and social issues that Indigenous youth face today, including the generational impacts of the residential school system on families and communities.
- 4. Must demonstrate the ability to identify with mandate, policies and procedures of the organization.
- 5. Must have a criminal record check completed by and satisfactory to UNYA.
- 6. Proof of Covid-19 vaccination will be required.
- 7. Given the needs of the youth accessing our programs, priority will be given to qualified Indigenous, First Nations, Metis, Inuit candidates as per section 41 of the Human Rights code.
- 8. Vehicle/driving abstract/first aid requirements (if relevant to the position)

Duties and Responsibilities:

- 1. Establish rapport with youth who self-refer to the program. Gather information through interviewing techniques, observing the youth, and soliciting information from professionals involved with the youth.
- 2. Assess youth and provide them with a connection to appropriate resources and services.
- 3. Implement care-plans and intervention strategies using a variety for techniques, such as the Person-Centered Approach, Family Systems Approach, and Trauma Informed Approach. Provide one-on-one informal counselling.
- 4. Create a safe space for all youth and staff by responding to behaviors and situations through a trauma informed lens, modelling respectful behavior.
- 5. Demonstrate commitment to the team as a positive, active participant who treats others in a respectful and supportive manner.
- 6. Establish and maintain a network of positive working relationships with other UNYA programs and other community programs/resources.
- 7. Maintain appropriate statistical records, logs, case files, and client reports in order to meet both UNYA and its funder's requirements.
- 8. Positively and proactively address any concerns, incidents or crises which affect youth participants, program operation and mandate, UNYA policies, and community relations.


