



Day Scholars and Children of Day Scholars

The Kamloops Indian Band (Ttes) and the Sechelt Nation (SN) launched the Day scholar Class Action suit to seek compensation on behalf of all First Nation who attended Indian Residential School, but who did not sleep there.

Currently **no formal application process is in place** but Ttes and SN Day Scholar executives are requesting that a data base be developed to help determine the number of Day Scholars and their children.

We have been provided an extension date of JULY 8, 2016

As a result Squamish Nation Council are encouraging our Squamish Nation Members to fill out the attached form listing your name, birth date, school and the number of years you attended. Then list your children and their information, please remember to include your current address.

For those Squamish Nation children whose parent(s) were Day Scholar(s) but are no longer living please complete the form to the best of your ability. You may need to visit a relative to determine the number of years your parent attended the school. Please include all your siblings and there addresses.

Chiefs and Council encourage our members to complete the form and submit it by the due date. It is important that no one is left out of the Day Scholar Class Action. Therefore we are asking Squamish Nation members to contact their Off-Reserve family who may have been Day Scholars to go to the SN Webpage at www.squamish.net for information and form.
