The Education, Employment & Training Department is offering the Parents as Literacy Supporters Program, (PALS) is a program that gives parents and caregivers new ways to support their preschool and kindergarten-aged children's learning in fun and interactive ways.

Each PALS session focuses on learning through play, and includes time for parents and caregivers to talk with a facilitator, and time for adults and children to learn, play and have fun together. The program aims to help make a positive transition from home and other early care settings to school.

Aboriginal PALS training was created for Aboriginal communities in consultation with Elders and other Aboriginal Community leaders. Aboriginal PALS (Parents as Literacy Supporters) is play-based and culturally responsive.
