Yúusnewas is a Skwxwú7mesh community-led project to research and document the residential school experiences of our stélmexw (people). Our intent is to provide a safe space to listen to our truth-tellers and to take care of one another with cultural, emotional, and spiritual wellness support. This process has our ancestors, truth-tellers, and stélmexw at its heart as we highlight pathways of healing for today and generations to come.

As the Yúusnewas Project continues, the Nation has been sharing frequent video updates to keep community members informed about the latest phase of work.

Field work for the Yúusnewas Project began in August and continued throughout the fall. Three different methods of ground analysis were used: Ground Penetrating Radar (GPR), LiDAR, and Electrical Resistivity. All three provide different layers of information.

In all, more than 50 million data points were generated by the groundwork. We now head into the next phase of the work: analysing all that information.











To the Squamish People,

Nexwsxwníwntm ta Úxwumixw (Council) thanks Members for raising their concerns regarding the annual regular Distribution amount as part of the People's Assembly Member Resolutions process. We recognize that this is a priority issue for our community, and we are taking steps to address it.

First, Nexwsxwníwntm ta Úxwumixw has approved a one-time special payment of \$1000 to each Member. This payment is a result of the Nation's returns on investments and will be issued on December 7 and 8, 2023 along with the regular Distribution.

Second, we have directed Nation staff to develop a policy to link the annual regular Distribution amount to the Canadian Consumer Price Index (CPI) to address Members' concerns around the increased cost of living.

These decisions are consistent with the staff recommendations provided to the People's Assembly in April 2023.

Direct deposit will be issued on December 6. Pick-up will take place between 8:30 am and 4:00 pm on December 7 and 8 at Totem Hall, Squamish Valley and Eslha7an Learning Centre, North Vancouver. This information is also available at squamish.net/distribution-notice.

Please note that this one-time special payment and regular Distribution will not be issued to Members who currently have outstanding debts to the Nation.

SQUAMISH NATION CALL FOR CARVERS

OPPORTUNITY

Matthews West and St'a7mes School are seeking proposals from Squamish Nation carvers or carver teams for:

- One traditional dug out cedar canoe carving (20ft long approximately)
- Three traditional paddle blades (5-6 ft in length approximately)

The carving work will form part of a playground in the new Sp'akw'us Feather Park located in Squamish. The canoe will become a play feature for children to connect with Skwxwú7mesh stories from the land.

The carving will take place at St'a7mes School in Squamish as an artist in residency program as an opportunity for the guest artist to teach and showcase traditional canoe making to students.

Squamish Nation Members are welcome to submit an expression of interest for the carving of a canoe. The commissioned value of the canoe and paddles is \$18,000.

Location

Sp'akw'us Feather Park is a new 12.5 acre park, located at the tip of Átl'ka7tsem (Howe Sound), formerly known as Nexen Beach. The canoe and paddles will be installed in a nature-based playground that was designed by the Indigenous Youth Leadership group at St'a7mes School to re-share Skwxwú7mesh stories and symbolism related to the surrounding landscape.

Paddle Blade and Canoe Carving Requirements

- Paddle blades must be constructed to be affixed to a cedar post and must be suitable for outdoor exposure.
- Canoe is intended to be permanent and must be structurally sound, durable, low maintenance, vandal-resistant, functional, and safe for public use. The canoe must be sturdy to accommodate heavy play use and high traffic. This could entail thicker walls and the use of an epoxy resin finish.
- Approximate size: 5.5m by 1m wide
- Canoe must have a flat bottom so it can be affixed to a foundation (see attached).
- The canoe does not need to be built to be seaworthy as it will reside on land.
- A cedar log will be provided for the canoe carving. The wood for the paddle blades will need to be supplied by the artist, however, we will be willing to work with the artist to source supplies.
- It would be beneficial if the artist had experience working with epoxy and other finishes that are suitable for outdoor exposure.
- Designs shall not include any breach of intellectual property, trademarks, brands or images of illegal activity.
- Design must consider accessibility and consider the addition of a transfer bar.
- Maintenance requirements for the canoe and paddles must be provided.
- Criminal Record Check will be required to work at the school.
- Willingness to work at St'a7mes School and with indigenous youth.
