

First Nations Child and Family Services and Jordan's Principle Settlement

The Court has approved the Settlement Agreement in the First Nations Child and Family Services and Jordan's Principle Class Action. This means that Canada will pay \$23.34 billion in compensation for impacted First Nations children and some of their family members.

What's the Settlement about?

The Settlement provides compensation to First Nations children living on reserves or in the Yukon who were removed from their homes by child welfare agencies operating in First Nations communities and placed in out-of-home care between April 1, 1991 and March 31, 2022.

The Settlement also provides compensation to First Nations children who did not receive timely access to essential services and who had a confirmed need for those services between April 1, 1991 and November 2, 2017. This treatment discriminated against the children and broke a legal rule known as Jordan's Principle.

Am I included in the Settlement?

Compensation is not yet available. When it becomes available, you may be eligible for compensation if you are one or more of the following:

A child removed from their home or placed off-reserve

Removed Child Class

A child who had a denial or delay of an essential service

Jordan's Principle Class

Trout Child Class

Essential Service Class

 First Nations children (living onreserve or off-reserve) who were confirmed to need an essential service but faced a delay, denial or a gap in receiving that essential service between April 1, 1991 and November 2, 2017.

A child placed off-reserve

Kith Child Class*
Kith Family Class*

- First Nations children who, while under the age of majority between April 1, 1991 and March 31, 2022, were living on a reserve and were removed from their homes by child welfare authorities or voluntarily placed into care.
- The placement was funded by Indigenous Services Canada (ISC).
- At least one caregiver (parents or grandparents) were resident on reserve or living in the Yukon.

- First Nations children placed off-reserve with a non-family caregiver.
 - The caregiver did not receive any funding related to the placement.
 - A Child Welfare Authority was involved at the time of the placement.
- Caregiving parent or grandparent of children of the Kith Child Class
- *If you think you are in this group or their parent or grandparent, and you want to be excluded from the settlement, you can remove yourself by submitting an Opt-Out Form, by January 15, 2024. If you submit the Opt-Out Form, you will not receive compensation from the settlement.

The caregiving parent or grandparent of a child who experienced removal or a delay or denial of an essential service

This includes birth, adoptive and step parents.

It does not include foster parents.

A fund of \$50 million will be established to assist First Nations children and families impacted by Canada's discrimination. An additional fund of \$90 million will be established to benefit high-needs Jordan's Principle class members to ensure their personal dignity and well-being.



Jordan's Principle

Named in memory of <u>Jordan River Anderson</u> from Norway House Cree Nation in Manitoba, Jordan's Principle ensures that all First Nations children can access the products, services and supports they need, when they need them.

<u>Jordan's principle</u> recognizes that First Nation Children may need government services that exceed the normative standard of care and will evaluate the individual needs of the child to ensure <u>substantive</u> <u>equality</u>, culturally appropriate services, and/or to safeguard the best interests of the child.

Who is covered

Services provided under Jordan's Principle are available to:

- Registered First Nations children* living on or off reserve;
- First Nations children entitled to be registered, under the Indian Act including
 - those who became entitled to register under the December 22, 2017 amended provisions of the Indian Act, under Bill S-3;
 - Infants under 18 months; and
- Any Indigenous child, including Non-Status First Nation or Métis, who are ordinarily resident on reserve.

* For the purposes of Jordan's Principle, a "child" is defined as an individual who is under the Age of Majority within their province or territory. In BC the age of majority is 19. As such, eligibility for Jordan's Principle ceases when Age of Majority is attained (Date of the child's 19th birthday).

Are you protected against Measles?



BC recently confirmed its first case of Measles since 2019. Measles is extremely contagious and is spread through the air by coughing and sneezing, and remains present in a room for several hours.



An unvaccinated person who is infected by measles can have serious complications, such as pneumonia, hearing loss, brain injury, and death. In pregnant women, measles infection can lead to miscarriage, premature labor, or a low birthweight baby.



The symptoms of measles are fever, red watery eyes, which may be sensitive to light, cough, runny nose, and a rash.



To protect yourself, your loved ones, and your community, it is important to ensure your vaccinations are up-to-date. In BC 2 doses of measles-containing vaccine is 99% effective against contracting measles. The vaccine is safe.



Please check your Immunization Records and/or contact your health care provider to ensure that you and your family are up-to-date with your immunizations.



In BC, the measles vaccine is usually given to children as a series of two doses. The first dose, known as the Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR) vaccine, is given on or soon after a child's first birthday. The second dose is called the Measles, Mumps, Rubella, and Varicella (MMRV) vaccine, and is given around the time a child starts school.





This information bulletin is to inform Members whom own dogs that due to numerous complaints about dogs running at large creating safety concerns for Members and their pets the Nation will be enforcing the Animal Control Bylaw which states in Section 18, "Every Owner of Possessor of a Dog must ensure that the Dog does not Run at Large within Squamish Lands." And Section 19 states, "An Animal Control Bylaw Officer may seize and Impound any Dog:

- (a) Found running at large,
- (b) That is an Unlicensed Dog or
- (c) That, the Animal Control Bylaw Officer, on reasonable grounds, believes has inflicted an unprovoked bite on a person or another animal.

If your Dog is found running at large and is impounded, it is the responsibility of the owner of the Dog to pay the impound fees and is subject to a fine as per Section 31 of the Animal Control Bylaw, 2004 which states, " (1) It is an offence to

- (a) Do or cause to be done anything,
- (b) Neglect to or refrain from doing anything, or
- (c) suffer or permit anyone doing anything

in contravention of this bylaw.

(2) Every person who contravenes section 31(1) is guilty of an offence and is liable to imposition on summary conviction a fine not exceeding One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars or imprisonment for a term not exceeding thirty (30) days or both.

About Senákw:

Senakw, situated on Kitsilano Indian Reserve No. 6, represents the largest First Nations-led real estate project in Canada. This project aims to bring forth a community aligned with Squamish values, offering various amenities such as much-needed rental homes, affordable housing units, Canada's first Indigenous-led net-zero carbon housing development, and other sustainable features, all contributing to the reestablishment of a thriving village.

Opportunity for Squamish Nation Community Members on the Senakw Cultural Advisory Panel:

The Senákw Cultural Advisory Panel is offering **three** seats to Squamish Nation community members who wish to contribute to the authentic expression of cultural identity within the Senákw development. Candidates must be a member of the Squamish Nation. The term will be for 12 months, with an end date of April 2025.

The Seńákw Cultural Advisory Panel will be composed of members who provide leadership and guidance on authentic cultural identity expression for the Seńákw Development Partnership, Nch'kay West. The panel will include technical staff, Squamish Nation community members and up to three Project Specific Advisors. The purpose of the Seńákw Cultural Advisory Panel (the "panel") is to oversee matters related to cultural design, ensuring that cultural sensitivity, diversity, and inclusivity are integrated into all aspects of project. The panel will provide cultural guidance and recommendations to Nch'kay West for opportunities that will be considered by the Partnership to incorporate Skwxwú7mesh cultural identity into the Seńákw development at Kitsilano Indian Reserve No. 6. The panel will help to foster creativity, respect cultural heritage, and promote positive cross-cultural interactions within the Squamish Nation.

Time Commitment and Remuneration:

Panel members will be compensated for their time commitment through honoraria. While the exact time commitment is not yet finalized, panel members can expect to attend meetings, participate in events, and allocate time for document review. Typically, these commitments will occur once every 2-3 months, but adjustments may be made to accommodate project demands.

The main objectives of the panel members include the following:

- Reviewing and advising on Seńakw Development 'designs,' which encompass interior, exterior, and landscape planning and arrangements, to ensure cultural design integration aligns with Coast Salish design, cultural values, traditions, and sensitivities.
- Reviewing and providing comments for opportunities to incorporate Skwxwú7mesh cultural identity within the Senakw project.
- Providing comments and expertise on proposed cultural design elements, materials and strategies to
 ensure authenticity.
- Provide comments on the objectives, and goals of the cultural identity expression at Senákw.
- Enhance awareness and cultural understanding among project stakeholders.

INDIGENOUS MONITOR SPOTLIGHT

Did you know that we have full time Indigenous Monitors on site during Project construction? The Nation has hired 6 Indigenous Monitors to be eyes and ears for the Nation at the WoodfibreLNG and FortisBC Eagle Mountain Gas Pipeline (EGP) Projects. All of these individuals completed archaeology, culture and environmental training we provided in the fall of 2023. This is the first time the Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw has had a regulatory role to oversee a project of this kind. As a result, these positions were created to support the nation in it's regulatory role.

We interviewed Christine & Stacey (pictured below), who have been working on the FortisBC EGP Project since Nov 2023 and here's what they had to say:

Q. What does a typical workday entail?

A. We meet at Totem Hall and look through the daily reports and head off to site. Some days we stay on the mainland to visit the BC Rail site (East portal), check the water monitoring system in the river, then we head up the Forest Service Road to inspect pipeline construction, converse with the environmental team and discuss what's on the work scope for upcoming projects. We also inspect different/all areas of the project, taking pictures, and noting down if there's any deficiencies. Other days we head across the water to monitor the work progression of the West tunnel and the quarry located at Swiýát.

Q. What is your favorite part of your job?

A. We are most focused on learning the environmental and inspection aspect of pipelining. We enjoy being a mentor to our colleagues. The personnel we have worked with on this project make our job enjoyable. When working on big projects a family type bond is formed. The ones we have met so far are professional, communicative, respectful and knowledgeable on the CEMP (Construction Environmental Management Plan - approved by Squamish Nation).

Q. Any other comments you'd like to add?

A. We are thrilled to be on this ground breaking project. Not only is the Woodfibre LNG plant projected for ZERO emission, the tunnel is one of the longest petroleum tunnel's in the world and our position out here is the first of it's kind. We are so proud to be part of the team.

FEBRUARY 2024

ONGOING CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

With both projects in the construction phase you may observe more activity downtown and at Swiýát.



Swiýát (WOODFIBRE LNG)

As noted in previous newsletter, marine construction needed to be complete by the end of January to avoid overlap with Slhawt' (herring) and Cháyilhen (salmon) season, this has now happened and marine construction will be paused until August 2024.

Skwxú7mesh Úxwimixw now has full-time Indigenous Monitors at Swiýát as eyes and ears for the for the Nation to make sure Skwxú7mesh Úxwimixw conditions of approval are met.

WoodfibreLNG will also be wrapping up vegetation clearing shortly, before birds start their nest-building for the season.

The floatel is expected to arrive and house workers as early as April. Non-local workers will be transported from Vancouver directly to Swiýát on 2 -week rotations, transported by boat from Vancouver to avoid local impacts such as housing, traffic and social services.

FORTIS BC EAGLE MOUNTAIN PIPELINE

To avoid surface disturbances at the Squamish River and estuary, a tunnel is planned underneath.

FortisBC is assembling the tunnel boring machines and starting tunneling work at BC Rail (east tunnel portal) and Swiýát (west tunnel portal).

Pipeline construction early-works are on-going along the Mamquam Forest Service Road and traffic may be impacted during this time. Keep an eye out for signage and potential delays. Indigenous Monitors continue to monitor construction activities on all EGP sites.

Census Housing Data Available

On this topic, we heard about the key issues our Members are facing, such as housing affordability, availability, and satisfaction with their homes.

- Around half of respondents are satisfied with their homes, though people who are younger or who rent tend to be less satisfied with their homes.
- ★The top challenges related to housing are affordability and availability.
- A small percentage (2.68%) of respondents say they do not have a stable place to live.
- ★Most people currently living off Skwxwú7mesh lands want to move home soon and most people currently living on Skwxwú7mesh lands want to stay.

Census Identity, Culture, and Language Data Available

On this topic, we heard from our Members how connected they feel to Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw culture.

- ★ Nearly 80% of respondents are able to spend time engaged in culture and language activities monthly.
- ★ More than 90% of respondents are proud of their identity, and a strong majority (69%) feel a sense of belonging with Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw.
- Most respondents aren't fluent in Skwxwú7mesh sníchim and only 8% are somewhat fluent.
- ★ More than half of respondents sometimes or often eat traditional foods (67%), participate in ceremonies (55%), and use traditional medicines (52%).




