# Seńákw Cultural Advisory Panel Terms of Reference and Applicant Call Out

On tem welhxs (February) 2, 2024 Nexwsxwníwntm ta Úxwumixw (Council) approved the Terms of Reference (TOR) for the Seńákw Cultural Advisory Panel. The purpose of the Panel is to provide guidance on incorporating Skwxwú7mesh cultural identity and designs into the Seńákw development.

The Panel is seeking three Nation Members to join for a one-year term. Panel members are expected to attend meetings, review designs, and provide expertise on cultural elements. They receive an honorarium for their time.

The deadline to express interest is tem tsá7tskaý (April) 5, 2024. Members can apply by submitting a cover letter and resume in one of three ways:

#### **Promoting Sport and Recreation**

On tem welhxs (February) 2, 2024 Nexwsxwníwntm ta Úxwumixw (Council) passed a resolution directing Nation staff to develop a sport and recreation strategy.

The Nation uses Own Source Revenue (OSR) to help fund recreation programming and facilities on the North Shore and Squamish Valley. OSR is also used to fund Sports and Recreation Grants and Cultural Grants, both of which are available to Members regardless of where they live. Both grant programs are extremely popular and well used by Membership.

To make sure that this funding is being used in the best way to benefit all Members, staff have been directed to create a strategy that includes:

- An evaluation of existing Nation-funded sport and recreation programs including the sports and culture grant programs.
- Recommendations for improving the overall effectiveness of Nation-funded sport and recreation programs.
- Future needs for new recreation facilities and parks.
- Consideration of the feasibility and advisability of new governance structures including a recreation commission for the administration of recreation planning and programming.
- Recommendations for measurable targets that can be used to monitor the overall effectiveness of the Nation's investments in sport and recreation.

Staff will report back to Nexwsxwníwntm ta Úxwumixw in a few months' time.
