



## What is the Housing List?

- The list of Squamish Nation Members who have applied for a custom home and lot allocation. The list is managed by Community Lands.
- The Housing Policy defines four categories of the Housing List: Single, Married/Common Law, Single Parent, Pensioner (65+).
- Past engagement with Members identified the priorities of bringing families back to the community and supporting Elders. The Nation has not allocated homes to the Single category.
- The last allocation was made on April 17, 2018, for the fiscal allocation year 2011/2012. The list that is currently being published is for the 2012/2013 fiscal year. If you applied after April 2013, you are on a later list based on the year you applied.

## How does my position on the Housing List change over time?

- There is one master list that includes every applicant. There are approximately 987 applicants on the 2012/2013 list. However, as of 2024, there are 1,389 total applicants, including those who applied before and after the 2012/2013 period.
- An applicant's position on the master list is based on their date of application. Applicants will always move up towards number 1 based on their date of application. An applicant will never move down the master list except in the extremely rare circumstance that there is an issue with another applicant's date of application that is investigated and corrected.

## Is this the list for the next allocation?

- No, this information is being provided for information only. It is the intention of Nation staff to provide the Housing List on an annual basis so that Members can see their position and update their information as needed.
- There is work to do before the Housing List can be used for the next allocation:
  1. As part of the Squamish Nation Housing Policy Framework, Nation staff are working on separating the 2006 Housing Policy into individual policies, including a standalone Allocations Policy. This work is underway and there will be more information provided in Spring 2024. The focus of this work is improving clarity, transparency, and consistency in the Allocations Policy.
  2. Many applicants on the Housing List have not updated their information, which means their category may be out of date. Before the next allocation, staff will be contacting those at the top of the list to ensure their information is up to date. Staff cannot change an applicant's information without a Category Change Form.



## How does my position in my category change over time?

- When an applicant changes categories or is removed from the list, this can cause other applicants to move up or down within a category. Their position on the master list is not impacted.
- An applicant's category may change when a family situation changes the category for which they are eligible (e.g., if they become married or common law, have children, etc.). The order of applicants within a category is based on their original date of application.



- Those currently in the Single Parent category with an application date later than Applicant B would move up one spot when Applicant B is removed from the Single Parent category.
- Note that the overall position of both applicants on the master list (which is based by date of application) has not changed. However, their positions within their eligible category have changed which will impact the order that allocations are made for that category.
