As provided for in section 2.2.1 of the Law, a Squamish member who is, or will be, at least 18 years of age on September 28, 2025 is entitled to vote in this general election.

To make a nomination for Band Manager or a member of Council, Form EC-1 Nomination Form must be used, available after June 4, 2025, from the Electoral Commission website or by contacting Member Services at membership@squamish.net or calling 604-982-7610.

All Candidates Meetings will be held:

September 6, 2025, from 1:00 to 4:00 pm at Totem Hall

September 7, 2025, from 1:00 to 4:00 pm at the Chief Joseph Mathias Centre

A voters list will be posted at least 60 days before the general voting day at the Squamish Nation administrative office, Chief Joe Mathias Centre, Totem Hall and on the official Squamish Nation website. If you are an eligible voter as defined in the Law and your name does not appear on the voters list, you may request a correction by contacting the Chief Voting Officer.

Eligible voters will be mailed a voting and election information package prepared in accordance with section 2.6.1 of the Regulation at least 30 days before the general voting day.


- Ensure your Annual Renewal is completed each year.
