#### Why a language nest?

It is our collective vision to breathe new life into 1st language speakers who will acquire fluency in the Skwxwú7mesh language within the Valley.

#### Language nests are:

- Total immersion (No English):
   Passing on the language in a natural way through meaningful communication.
- Culturally-grounded: Program design and activities are based on culture, to raise children in a nourishing and traditional way.
- Family/Community-based: Dayto-day activities involves parents, families and the communities support.

#### History

The Māori and Hawaiians began nests in the 1980 s. These were the stepping stones that created a huge revitalization movement.

Our aim is to bring up a new generation of fluent language speakers accompanied by their Parents/Caretakers who are looking forward to advancing the language within their homes.

#### Medical Travel for Members Living on Reserve: Info Sheet

When a member books a medical appointment that is more than 30 km away from home, with no closer options, they may qualify for a Gas PO. This happens in two ways:

1) Members living on reserve can contact Caroline @ Health Benefits: 236-877-7782 or by filling out and dropping off the attached intake form at Totem Hall.

The Member or someone acting for them can pick up the PO at Totem Hall.

\*\*There are no Squamish Nation Employee Drivers for this service\*\*

2) Elders can contact the Elders Team and book a ride with them.

The PO will be given to the Elders Driver.

3) All confirmation forms must be signed and returned.

\*\*Members living off reserve should contact FNHA directly at 1- 855-550-5454\*\*

#### **Gas PO Policy:**

- a) **48 hours-notice is required for ALL Gas PO requests**. Urgent requests will be considered on a case by case basis, time permitting.
- b) Only one active PO can be issued per trip.
- c) PO's are non-transferrable & must be returned if the appointment doesn't happen.
- d) **24 hours-notice is required for cancellations** with the Elder Drivers, as well as requests to change any Gas PO.



We will be drumming and singing through each Squamish Valley community to honour those that struggle with addiction.


