- **Total Immersion (No English):** Passing on the language in a natural way through meaningful communication.
- **Culturally-grounded:** Program design and activities are based on culture, to raise children in a nourishing and traditional way.
- **Family/Community-based:** Day-to-day activities involves parents, families and the communities support.

### History

The Māori and Hawaiians began nests in the 1980 s. These were the stepping stones that created a huge revitalization movement.

#### Children 0-5 Years with their Parents/Caregivers

Our aim is to bring up a new generation of fluent language speakers accompanied by their Parents/Caretakers who are looking forward to advancing the language within their homes.

### WHAT'S HAPPENED SO FAR?

Over the past two years, we've been collecting input from Skwxwú7mesh People about what should be in our constitution. We've heard your thoughts at Constitution Gatherings, family dinners, out in community and through the online surveys.

Here is a sample of what we heard so far:

*"I love our community, how I am able to feel a part of something greater than myself."*

*"Our language & our belief in working together will help to guide future generations."*


*"All the teachings I've learnt from a kid now made me who I am today and I'm proud to know that I can pass it to all my friends and acquaintances."*

### WHAT'S HAPPENING NOW?

Now, the Constitution Working Group is meeting regularly to start integrating Squamish People's ideas into what will become the first draft of our Constitution - Our Way of Being a Nation.

Throughout September and October, the topics of discussion have been:

- Our Story
- Our Language
- Amending the Constitution, and;
- Our Territory.





In fact, Our Territory has been the main topic of discussion for many of our meetings so far. A lot of the feedback we received reflects how much our people love the land and want to protect it for generations to come. That passion must be reflected in the constitution we are creating together.

### WHAT'S NEXT?

Over the next 4 months, the drafting team will continue to meet regularly to create a first draft of our Constitution. **That draft will be presented to Squamish Members in the spring of 2026.**

At that time, the working group will be seeking feedback on what parts of the Constitution you love, what parts you think need more work, and what parts you think may have been forgotten.

The Working Group is dedicating a lot of time to this important part of the process, and they can't wait to share it with you in the springtime.

## WINTER PARKING Friendly Reminder

Help us plow more safely & efficiently

All **vehicles** and **garbage totes** must be removed from the roads during snowfalls, until the roads have been plowed and salted. This helps us safely navigate the plow through tight spaces, and to ensure emergency vehicles have safe access, and that all roads are attended to.

Avoid a citation or having your vehicle towed, by removing your vehicle from the roads anytime during snow falls. Roads will be monitored by Public Safety. Please note: *Any towing will be at the Owner's expense.*

Effective November 24<sup>th</sup> 2025 to March 13<sup>th</sup> 2026: *no vehicle is permitted to be parked on roadways, cul-de-sacs, or common areas that the Nation is responsible for plowing and salting during snowfall periods.*





## FLOATEL 2 UPDATE

In order to maintain their project timeline, Woodfibre LNG plans to carry out some of their work simultaneously, thereby increasing the project workforce. As a result, Woodfibre LNG applied to add a second floatel in May 2025.

After a thorough review conducted under the Squamish Nation Environmental Assessment Agreement, Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw Council approved an amendment to the Woodfibre LNG project (at Swiyát) to allow for a second temporary floating worker accommodation, or “floatel” to house up to 735 additional, non-local project workers at the project site. This floatel will be in addition to the first floatel approved by the Nation in 2023 and stationed on site until the end of construction (expected in 2027).

### Woodfibre LNG has made the following commitments:

- Non-local workers are required to reside in company designated housing
- Workers will be transported by boat directly to site (from Darrell Bay and for local workers and from Vancouver for non-local workers) to avoid interactions in town and limit traffic impacts
- Out of town workers residing at the floatel are not allowed to travel to/from town during off-shift hours
- Several policies such as a Respectful Guest Policy, Zero-Tolerance Policy for Alcohol and Drugs, Worker Code of Conduct and Bullying, Harassment and Discrimination Policy are being enforced
- Mandatory worker trainings include Gender and Cultural Safety Training, Addictions Awareness Training, Harassment Prevention Training and training to support Don't be a Bystander behaviour
- Gender Safety Advisory Committee provides feedback on gender safety programming and recommendations on how Woodfibre LNG can address safety and security impacts to Indigenous women, other women and 2SLGBTQIA + people
- Reporting obligations such as a Confidential Reporting Line and Worker Feedback Program to support a culture of reporting
- Community Training such as Personal Safety, Risk Identification and Situation Awareness training offered to community members, Consent Training for local high schools in Squamish and training capacity to the local womens' centre (Pearl Space).
- Floatel Indigenous Cultural Managers on both floatels to educate workers on skwxwú7mesh úxwumixw culture and provide various supports to Indigenous (and non-Indigenous) workers
- Floatel and Workplace Culture Committee includes a Floatel Indigenous Cultural Manager tracks and make recommendations on supporting a respectful workplace




Image showing location of floatels

### WOODFIBRE LNG PROJECT CONSTRUCTION UPDATES


Woodfibre LNG’s construction has reached the 50% mark. Work has begun on installing the first permanent marine pile for the floating storage tank, following the successful placement of pipe racks and ongoing foundation work for processing infrastructure. Current site efforts are focused on maximizing construction activities during the marine least-risk window (August 16–January 31).
