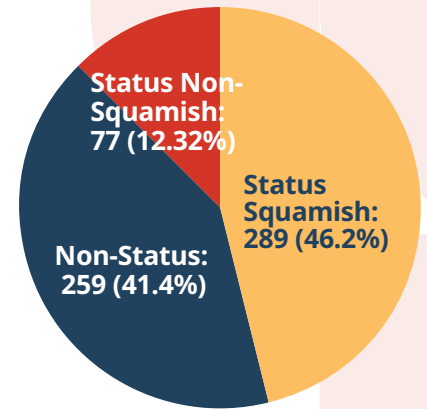

I chen t'ík! **Thomas Brimacombe** kwi en sna. My surname comes from my dad's English ancestors. I am Sk̓wx̓wú7mesh stelmexw (Squamish person) on my mom's side, from the George family. My grandma Hilda George was my most recent ancestor to live on Squamish Nation lands; my sister and I have been reconnecting with our family and heritage, and we now both live in Squamish Valley.

My family are originally from Eslha7á'í, so I've joked that if my ancestors could see me in Squamish Valley today, they would ask, "What are you doing all the way over there?" (Followed by, "And why do you look like you're xwelíten?") I still hope I'm making them proud.

Time working with the Nation: In January 2025, I began a six-month internship with Squamish Valley Operations; at the end of those six months, my position became permanent.
