FORTIS BC APPLICATION TO AMEND WASTE DISCHARGE AUTHORIZATION – UPDATE #2

FortisBC has applied to amend its Waste Discharge Authorization with the BC Energy Regulator. This change would allow an increase in the amount (volume) and levels (concentration) of certain metals in water discharged from the west tunnel portal at Swiyát (Woodfibre) as part of the Eagle Mountain Gas Pipeline Project.

Skw̓xwú7mesh Úxwumixw, through Senior Rights and Title staff, have continued to engage with FortisBC and the BCER to raise concerns. We are focused on ensuring discharge water meets appropriate BC Water Quality Guidelines and supports the protection of Átl'ka7tsem (Howe Sound).

There are three main components to the application FortisBC has submitted to:

1. Increase the volume of water that's discharged into East Creek (not fish bearing) under the permit due to higher water volumes than originally expected.
2. Increase allowable copper concentrations in the discharge water due to naturally high copper levels in the area (in other words water from the tunnel often dilutes copper levels in East Creek).
3. Increase allowable aluminum concentrations in the discharge water. We remain concerned about this request due to potential environmental impacts, our expectation is that water quality guidelines are met.

FortisBC recently constructed a second water treatment plant which has resulted in improved water quality. Skw̓xwú7mesh Úxwumixw Indigenous Monitors are on site full time to monitor conditions and Rights and Title will provide updates as more information becomes available.

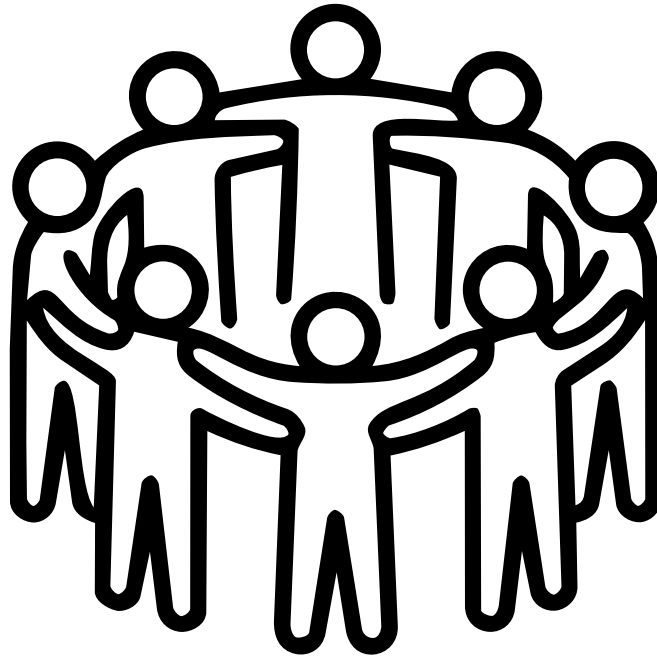
WOODFIBRE LNG COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM NOW ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS
