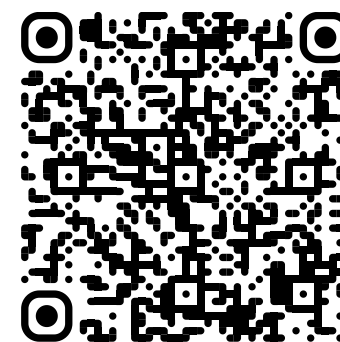

If you are a Squamish Nation Member and have been the victim or survivor of a crime or traumatic event, support is available through our in-house Justice Services Department in ts'its'ixwnítway (Member Services).

The Squamish Nation Victim Support (SNVS) Crime & Trauma-informed Support Services provides assistance to Squamish Nation member individuals, families, and community who have been impacted by crime and traumatic events.

After a major incident, whether recent or historical in nature, SNVS is here to help.

SNVS Services

- Emotional support
- Referrals to community supports
- Court orientation and accompaniment
- Connection to cultural resources (healing circles, brushing off, smudging, land-based traditional medicine, Longhouse stay, etc.)
- Victim impact statements
- Application for the Victims of Crime Assistance Program
- Application for Victim Restitution & Recovery

Court Orientation, Accompaniment, & Support

SNVS will assist you in navigating the criminal justice system, answer questions about court proceedings, update you on the status of your court case, accompany you to court, and provide emotional support.

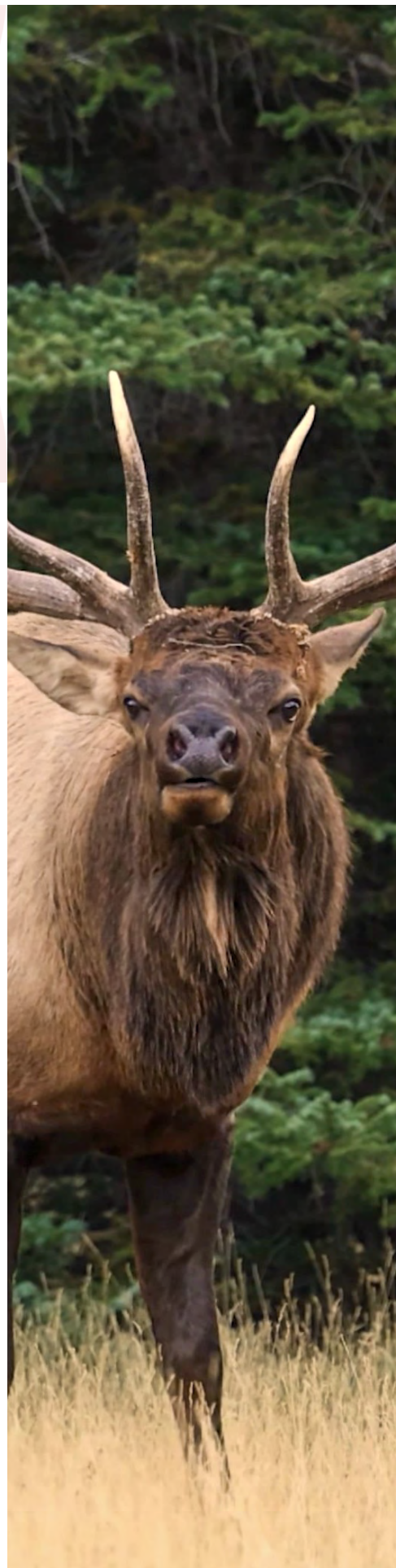

We're now accepting resolutions for the next People's Assembly! This is your chance to tell Council what matters most to you and help shape decisions for our community.

What's a Resolution? A resolution is a formal request or idea you bring forward for discussion and decision-making. It's how Squamish People can share priorities and concerns with Council in a clear and official way. Resolutions can be submitted by any eligible voter (18+) in the Squamish Nation.

A resolution is:

- ✓ A way to propose changes, ideas, or actions on issues important to the Nation.
- ✓ A way to clearly share your priorities and concerns with Council.
- ✓ A formal statement that must be voted on at the People's Assembly.

Resolutions are not ideal for:

- ⚠ Personal concerns or issues that apply to individuals, rather than the wider community.
- ⚠ Requests related to administrative matters that could be resolved with staff.
- ⚠ Ideas needing immediate action—they guide Council and may require more steps to implement.

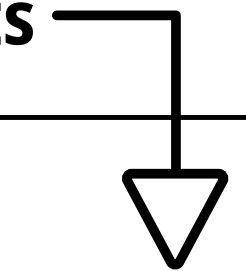

Background

Hiyám Housing Society is an incorporated non-profit Society formed by the Squamish Nation Council as part of its strategic priority to house every Squamish member within a generation. Estítkw Place is a 55-unit development that delivers supportive housing for vulnerable Squamish Nation members. These homes will be exclusively for Squamish Nation Members, people experiencing homelessness or are at risk of homelessness, with priority given to People with disabilities, LGBTQ2+ (Two-spirited), and people dealing with mental health and addiction issues.

General Purpose

The Tenant Support Worker helps tenants in supportive housing by providing emotional and cultural support, skill-building, and access to resources. Their goal is to build positive connections and promote safety and security. The TSW also assists tenants in overcoming obstacles and creating personal support systems.

Key Responsibilities and Duties

- Establish genuine and respectful working relationships with all tenants at Estítkw Place.
- Create a safe, accepting, and inclusive environment that values individuals' privacy and choices in personal life, leisure, education, and work.
- Assist tenants in developing support plans and connecting with appropriate supports and community-based resources.
- Establish and maintain a positive working relationship with other team members and Squamish Nation Departments.
- Participate in staff meetings, training programs, and workshops as necessary.
- Assist tenants in de-cluttering, cleaning, and preparing for pest control and monthly unit inspections.
- Assist with maintaining cleanliness and order on weekends in the common and staff areas.
- Prepare communal meals on weekend shifts.
- Monitor the flow of visitors by supervising the main entrance, ensuring visitors sign in/out, and noting the visitor's destination in the building.
- Identify and assess potential emergencies and respond appropriately and keeps accurate records, files, and log notes.

- Current First Aid/CPR, Naloxone, Mental Health First Aid, ASIST, Food Safe, Naloxone, and Non-Violent Crisis Intervention certification are required or willing to obtain within 2 months of being awarded the position.

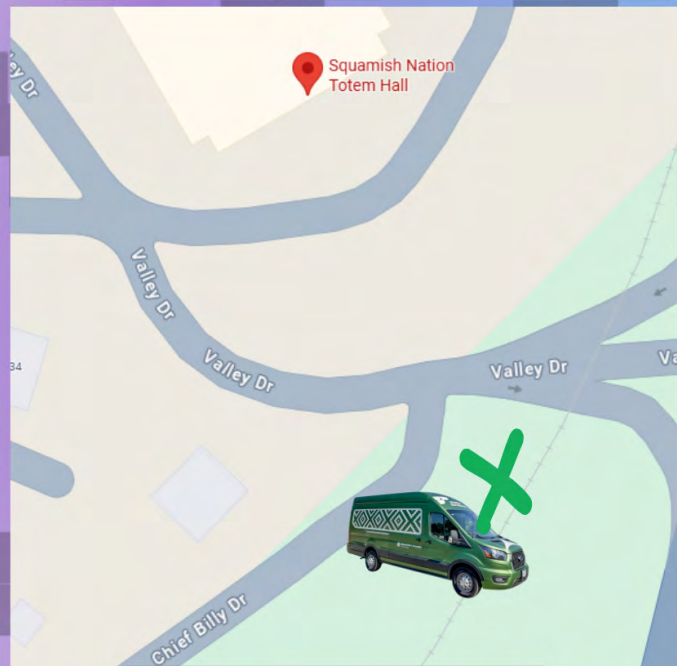

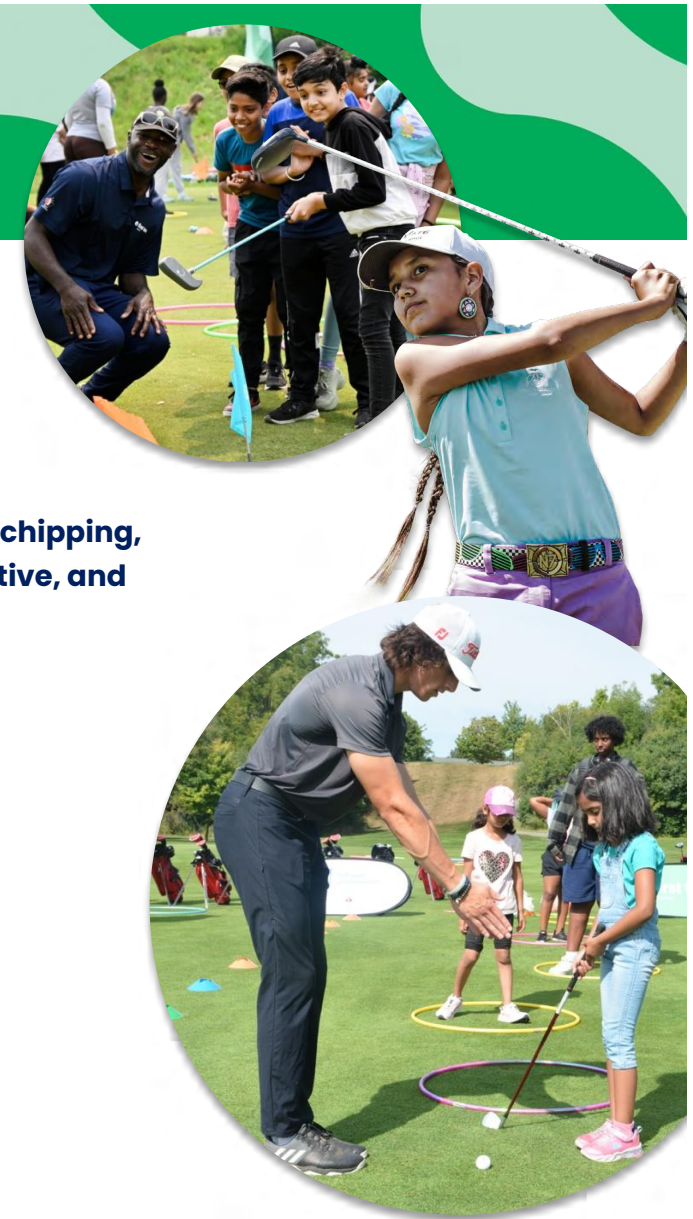

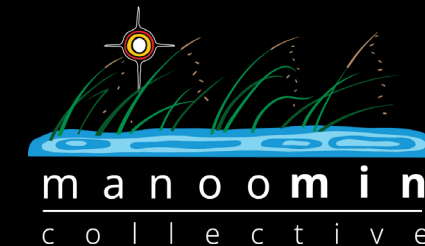
