Vancity to open future community branch at Seńákw

A new layer of village life is taking shape at Seńákw.

Nch'kaý Development Corporation will welcome Vancity to Seńákw as the project's first announced commercial tenant, marking an important step in the growth of the village's commercial spaces.

The future Seńákw Village Branch will also serve as Vancity's Centre of Indigenous Banking, bringing together its Indigenous Banking offerings in one location.

This milestone comes as first residents are being welcomed home. Together, these moments reflect continued progress toward the long-term vision for Seńákw: a modern Skwxwú7mesh village on Squamish Nation land, shaped by homes, services, public spaces, gathering places and amenities that support daily life.

Seńákw has always been envisioned as more than housing. It is a place for people to live, gather, access services and be connected to community. Vancity's future branch represents one of the first commercial services that will help support that vision as the village continues to grow.

Lower Stá7mes Community Celebration

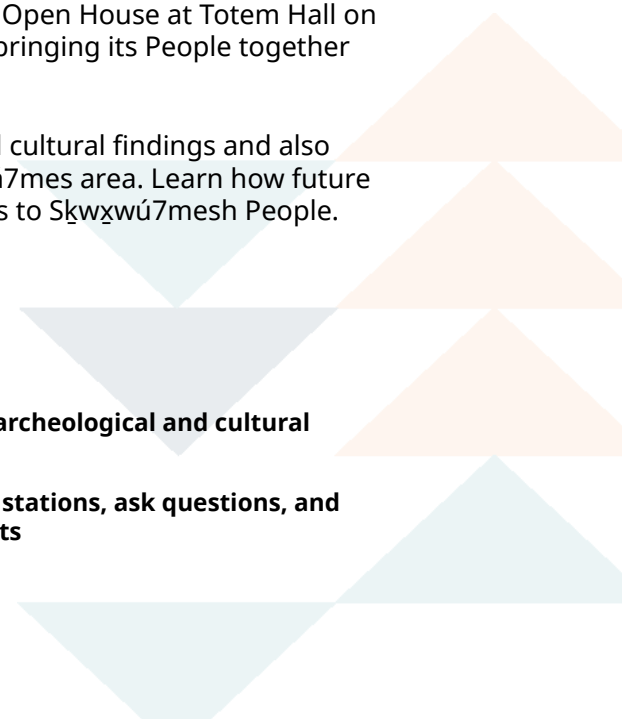
Wednesday, June 24, 5 - 8pm, Totem Hall

JOB OVERVIEW

Cheakamus Centre is looking for community-minded Indigenous Cultural Program Leaders who are passionate about sharing cultural teachings and helping others build strong connections to the land, culture, and one another. Programs take place at the Cheakamus Centre Longhouse. Situated next to the Ch'iyákmesh (Cheakamus) River and surrounding 165-hectare ecological preserve, the Longhouse provides an ideal setting for creating meaningful and enjoyable learning experiences for all. Cheakamus Centre is seeking staff members who are passionate about Coast-Salish culture and who enjoy working with children and youth in a land-based setting.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Lead hands-on Indigenous cultural learning activities such as wool weaving, cedar bark weaving, woodworking, traditional games and ethnobotany walks
- Assist with leading indigenous cultural program experiences, using agreed upon cultural content in a meaningful, professional and interactive way (e.g., traditional welcomes, storytelling, drumming, traditional cooking)
- Assist with preparation of supplies and facilities for cultural program activities (e.g. fire starting, cedar bark and wool preparation, meal service set up) and clean up at the end of the day
- Contribute to creating a safe and inclusive learning environment for all

To the members in the Valley who are looking for some support to achieve sobriety and be around like-minded people:

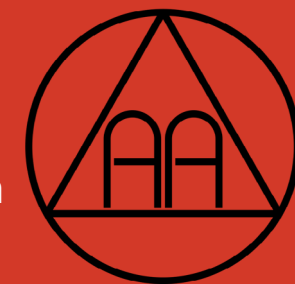

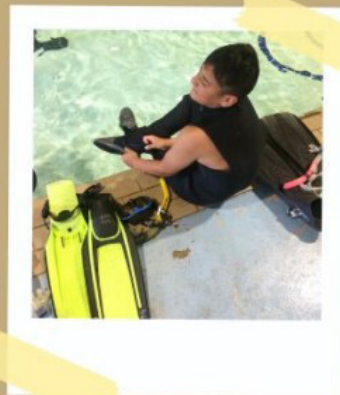
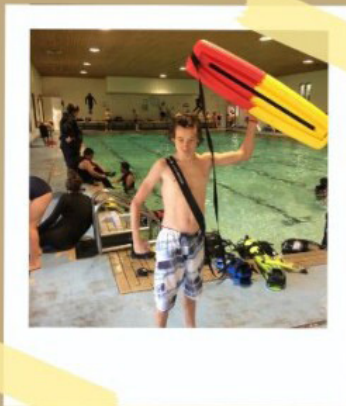


Lifeguard Leadership Camp

This weeklong camp is open to self-identified Indigenous youth (First Nation, Métis, Inuit) of all ages and will introduce the sport of Lifesaving & Lifeguarding for both beginners and advanced athletes. The camp will be delivered by certified Lifesaving Society and PADI instructors.

Venue: Green Bay Bible Camp in West Kelowna, BC

Lifesaving Stream: 13 years old by course start date & basic swimming ability

Lifeguarding Stream: 15 years old by course start date & Bronze Cross certification
